Sometimes, this is the only piece of mail they receive, and it reminds all of the love and hope symbolized by the season. CentrePeace Angels, a new program started in 2006 to give Centre County inmate trainees' children a gift at Christmas from their parent, Conflict Resolution Workshops and Retreats are available to the general public as well as correctional staff and inmates. The 10-hour course teaches skills in conflict resolution, mediation and the power of non-violence.
